PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES
NOVEMBER 19, 2009

PLANNING COMMISSION MEMBERS PRESENT: Chairman-Mark E. Martin, Jonathan Brumfield, Gerald Lehman, and Council Representative-Charles Long.

PLANNING COMMISSION MEMBERS ABSENT: None

NEW BUSINESS:

- ❖ Chairman Mark Martin welcomed guest speaker Jane Beasley, Town of Woodstock. Jane Beasley became the Coordinator in May of 2002. The Town of Woodstock has coordinated the following events:
 - Christmas Tree Lighting event;
 - Music on Main Street;
 - Halloween face painting;
 - Tours of the Historical Society Museum and gift bags with information;
 - Community yard sell in August with volunteers and merchants;
 - Added 16 new businesses since February;
 - Business promotions that Merchants participate with.

The Town of Woodstock has three committees: Design, Signs and Business Enhancement.

- ❖ Ilsa Weaver with East Gate Ministry gave a presentation regarding their organization and ministry to those in need. East Gate Ministry is interested in buying a home for pregnant women that are homeless. Some items of interest were discussed as follows:
 - East Gate Ministry is an independently funded organization which has a strict intake process;
 - Staff consists of a Social Worker, Counselor, Dietitians, Nurses and the Director of the ministry on site at all times;

- East Gate Ministries help with transitional care programs, education scholarship and job resources;
- East Gate Ministries provide transportation to and from doctor appointments;
- Once the women give birth to their child, both mother and child are placed in a transitional care program;
- The women must be 18 years of age or older and boyfriends are not allowed at the home;
- The women are given light responsibilities while staying at the home, and must go through individual and group counseling.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Rick Chandler

The Developer, Rob Lynch, is working on the master plan for the Lineweaver Property.
