August 10, 2015

- Shelley Newman gave the report. The movie the Grinch was shown July 25, about 50 people attended. There was a band on August 1st that brought in about 250 people, that has been our largest concert. August 8th, the movie Tangled was shown and that brought in about 80 people.
- A local Girl Scout troop is trying to earn their silver badge. They want to help with the community mural project.

Met with County Supervisors in regards to the possible annexation of Silver Lake Mill. They gave other suggestions on how to handle the annexation, the committee will take the suggestions under advisement. There will be an annexation meeting before the Sept. Council meeting.
