Town employees serve the public and seek to accomplish as much as our budget and staffing constraints allow. Authority & Board Vacancies

Looking to get involved in local government and have a voice in your community? We have vacancies on the Economic Development Authority and the Board of Zoning Appeals! We are looking for diverse candidates that have an interest in the future development of Dayton.

The Dayton Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) shall be responsible for conducting public hearings of 1) appeals of administrative decisions made by the Zoning Administrator, 2) applications for variances which are regulated by the Zoning Ordinance, and 3) the establishing of setbacks for non-conforming buildable lots of record within the Town. Members of the BZA are recommended by the Dayton Town Council and appointed by the Circuit Court of Rockingham County.

The primary purpose of the Dayton Economic Development Authority (EDA) is to administer the Town's Façade Enhancement Grant. The EDA meets quarterly to review and act on these applications unless there are no applications that quarter. Members of the EDA are appointed by the Town Council.

The Dayton Cemetery of Virginia <u>The Search for Harrison's Chapel of Ease</u>

The Dayton Cemetery of Virginia is pleased to announce that James Madison University archaeology students will soon be working in the oldest part of the cemetery in hopes of finding the Chapel of Ease, built around 1747.

Last spring, Fort Harrison sponsored a ground penetrating radar study of this section and the results of the study show the possibility of a portion of the building's foundation as well as some unmarked graves.

The students will be working under the supervision of Dr. Dennis Blanton. The plan is to excavate two perpendicular trenches, each six feet long, eighteen inches wide and eighteen inches deep. The excavation will be done this November, 2023. Daniel Harrison donated land for the chapel and it would become one of the oldest English chapels in Augusta Parish. A chapel of ease is a small church, built to meet the needs of a congregation when the traveling distance to the larger church is a hardship for parishioners.

This is an exciting time as we look forward to learning more about the earliest years of settlement here in the Dayton community.
