Community Meeting Scheduled for Dayton Greenway Project

Interested community members are invited to attend an open meeting on Thursday, March 31, 2016, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m., at the Dayton Municipal Building Council Chambers, 125 Eastview Street (north entrance—upper level). Town officials, the design team, town residents, and interested parties will discuss preliminary conceptual designs, which will help the town develop a multiuse greenway that traverses through a variety of areas in Dayton and connect various community assets within the downtown district.

The Town of Dayton is creating a conceptual master plan with the assistance of the Community Design Assistance Center (CDAC), an outreach center of Virginia Tech's College of Architecture and Urban Studies. The project is sponsored in part through a grant from the Virginia Department of Forestry Urban & Community Forestry Program and the U.S. Forest Service.

This project aims to help the Town of Dayton realize many goals: enabling pedestrians' safe access to key destinations within the town; spurring economic development by providing a trail system, which connects town assets to tourist destinations; promoting active living through greenway development; providing opportunities for displaying interpretive signage/art about local history, culture, people and place; and enhancing the streetscape and associated open spaces within the town.

At the public meeting on March 31st, the design team will give a 45-minute presentation to describe the grant awarded to the Town of Dayton, and explain the two preliminary design concepts. Attendants at the presentation will be asked to comment, provide feedback, and come to a consensus about the design ideas presented. After this meeting, CDAC student designers will revise the design by consolidating the two concepts into one, final conceptual design, which will be presented at a later date. This design process and final design concept will be documented in a report, which the Town of Dayton can use to leverage funding for implementation.

The team from the Community Design Assistance Center completes community design work using a participatory design process, so it is crucial to hear the public's voice and opinion. All participants' time will count toward Dayton's required in-kind contribution, which is a requirement of the grant.

The design team hopes that this open meeting will attract a broad range of community groups such as the town council, local citizen groups, local residents, business owners, employees/staff within the downtown district, hikers, bikers, artists, and others who have a vested interest in the location and character of a proposed greenway/trail network in Dayton.

Interim Manager's Report

Spring is beginning to "spring" in the Town. Clean up and maintenance is continuing at our parks in anticipation of pleasant weather and upcoming activities.

The Easter Egg Hunt will be held at Sunset Park on March 26th, at 2:00 p.m. This fun event will be followed by the Redbud Festival on April 9th. For additional details on both events, please visit the Town's website.

Two significant Town projects are moving forward. One is the development of Well #4 to provide an additional supply for our water system. The well is a good one that has test pumped at over 1.5 million gallons per day. We expect this well to be online on or about August 1st.

The second is the Sidewalk Improvement Project that will extend a new sidewalk from Wilbur Pence Middle School along Bowman Road to College Street. This project is scheduled for completion by August 8, 2016. Finally, it's budget time again. The Finance Committee will be presenting a draft fiscal plan for FY 2016-17 in the near future. By law, we are required to have an adopted budget in place by July 1st.

Reminder Regarding Yard Waste Collection

With the warm weather approaching and the days getting longer, it's time for sprucing up our lawns and gardens. Please remember that all

yard waste (except for limbs larger than your finger), must be placed in <u>paper</u> biodegradable bags, and be free of household trash, rocks or dirt.

Tree limbs and trimmings too large to bag must be tied in bundles not exceeding five feet in length and of reasonable size to allow convenient handling. Disposal of tree stumps, trunks or limbs larger than six inches in diameter is the responsibility of the property owner.

Chief's Corner

You may not be aware that the Town of Dayton once had a vibrant Neighborhood Watch Program that was the envy of surrounding communities. At its best, the Neighborhood Watch kept it simple. Our members were a group of well intentioned citizens who valued their neighbors, and who enjoyed one another's company. Together they met once a month to conspire to do good within Dayton, and had a lot of fun together in the process.

The Dayton Neighborhood Watch fundraises during community events, and the proceeds go towards Operation Care and the UVA Children's Hospital. The Dayton Police Department also utilizes the membership in times of need. For instance, a toddler may have wondered from a house and is in danger. The Dayton PD would alert Dayton Neighborhood Watch members via text or email to be an extra set of eyes in such an event. Over time, the group has suffered attrition as key members moved out of the area, and some became so encumbered by other family activities that the program now exists in a less-than-robust state. Let's change that. The world needs more communities joining together for the *good* of humankind and I'm looking for help from you.

Now, I'm sure you've questions, maybe misconceptions of what the Dayton Neighborhood Watch is, so do give me the opportunity to ease your mind. As a member of the Dayton Neighborhood Watch, you would not be issued a detectives hat, nor given a trench coat as some Neighborhood Watch signage is misinterpreted. You would not act as a police officer, or a private eye. The group would not be of use to you to espouse political agenda. It is most defiantly NOT a Dayton Police Department program.
