NOTICE ON RECYCLING PESTICIDE CONTAINERS

A lot of plastics are being recycled for products that are used by children. It is unlawful to recycle pesticide containers with your normal recycling. In an effort to follow federal laws, Dayton Public Works will accept pesticide containers properly prepared per the manufacturer's instruction booklet, which is usually attached to the container, effective immediately. Pesticide containers will be recycled separately at Rockingham County Landfill, and must be completely empty, triple-rinsed, caps removed, and the product label identifying the product must remain attached. Please place pesticide containers at curbside beside your yard waste for the weekly collection on Mondays.




