Spring is here and the bunnies have already starting showing up around town. There was little opportunity for the kids and kids at heart to play in the snow this winter, but there is always next year. I am very happy to announce that our new water treatment plant went live in February and the town was able to pay for the 3.3-million-dollar project from our reserves. There will be a ribbon cutting and open house at the plant on May 12 at 9 am. Feel free to come and tour the new facility. Dayton is very unique, as we have no debt and a terrific credit rating. Most municipalities have sizeable debt.

After a longer construction phase than expected, I am happy to announce that Glo Fiber is available in most neighborhoods in town. "This House is Glo-ing" yard signs are popping up around town and I can assure you from personal experience that this internet service is significantly faster at a lower cost than what you may be using now.

I'm proud of our town council for their continued support of infrastructure projects and the allocation of funds to complete these projects. The town has made significant progress on improvements and this year will be no different.

We have many exciting events scheduled for this year. The annual Redbud Festival is April 15th and will feature more than 100 vendors displaying their arts and crafts, live music, carriage rides, antique cars, pony rides and more. National Night Out, Dayton Days and the Summer Concert Series will bring visitors to town which will give a boost in revenue for our businesses while providing fun activities for our residents.

The planning commission and staff have been working on the town's comprehensive plan since last year and it is now complete. The plan is updated every five years and will serve as an outline of goals and objectives for transportation, public services and facilities, public safety, water and sewer services, parks and recreation, beautification, cultural and historic resources and capital improvement projects.

I look forward to seeing everyone at the events supporting our town and local businesses!

Are you a resident and registered voter in the Town of Dayton? Are you passionate about local issues and helping your community? If so, a seat on the Dayton Town Council may be right for you! One Council seat with a term ending December 31, 2024 will be on the ballot at a Special Election which will be held on November 7, 2023. Candidates run without party affiliation and there is no primary.

Residents interested in running for Town Council must file all paperwork with the Rockingham County Voter Registrar's Office by **7 p.m. on Tuesday, June 20, 2023.**

Spring Cleaning Reminders

Please keep the following information in mind while working on your Spring home projects!



Heavy/bulk items are collected at curbside on the first Tuesday of each month by the Dayton Public Works.

May Heavy Trash will be collected on May 4 instead of May 2.



Yard waste (grass, weeds, leaves, garden waste, small twigs) is collected weekly by the Dayton Public Works Department. All yard waste must be placed in paper biodegradable bags only and free of all other trash items. Tree Limbs/Bush trimmings must be tied in bundles not exceeding five feet in length and of reasonable size to allow convenient handling with no limbs greater than six inches in diameter. Anything larger than this must be disposed of by the property owner.



Remember to regularly mow your lawn! Grass or weeds must be cut before reaching eight inches in height from their base to their most extended growth. Please refrain from blowing grass onto the road & sidewalk.



Home improvement projects? Please remember to contact Miss Utility before you dig. Projects such as decks, fencing, accessory buildings, and mailbox placement may require zoning approval. Please contact the Town before beginning work!

Ground Penetrating Radar Study Conducted at Fort Harrison

Recent discoveries at Fort Harrison help us to better understand what life was like here on the inner frontier during the years leading up to and during the French and Indian War. For several years we have enjoyed the privilege of working with Dr. Dennis Blanton of the James Madison University Anthropology Department and his archaeology students.

The next step in our quest to unearth more knowledge about those early years is a geophysical study using advanced GPR (ground penetrating radar) and magnetometry.

GPR is a non-intrusive process that uses radar pulses to image the subsurface. When used in archaeology, GPR detects underground features and directs where excavations will be most useful.

Archaeo-Geophysical Associates, LLC of Fort Collins, Colorado, recently conducted the study of the grounds of Fort Harrison as well as the surrounding fields and pasture. The Board of Directors looks forward to hearing the results of the survey. The board also extends its thanks to the Koogler family for allowing us to examine their property, which surrounds the house and summer kitchen.

A grant from the Virginia Commonwealth Fund as well as contributions from local businesses and friends of Fort Harrison made this project possible.

Wayfinding Signage Update

The Town of Dayton has received VDOT approval to proceed with Wayfinding Signage. There will be 20 directional signs throughout Town pointing visitors to significant areas of interest. The two existing gateway signs on Route 42 will also be replaced to match the wayfinding signs. A preliminary sketch of the signs is seen below. The Town is currently accepting bids for fabrication and installation, and hopes to have the project completed no later than Spring of 2024.
