Manager's Memo

These are unprecedented times in which we are living. So much uncertainty, conflicting information, and continually changing circumstances. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we try to continue all Town services, while also ensuring that our staff and the public stay well.

At the time of this printing, Town offices remain closed to the public; however staff is working. Payments, forms and other documents can be dropped off in the "Payment" box located just before the window in the drive-thru lane. Other business can be conducted by phone, email, or by special appointment. Limited staff that are able to work from home are, but staff is taking messages and forwarded them on so that your calls will be returned.

We understand that many residents are or may be losing their income temporarily as many businesses are having

to shut down or seriously alter their business functions. We are dedicated to ensuring you continue to have water, sewer, and trash service as well as police and public safety services. Our staff will keep physical distance from the public as is possible, to avoid getting sick or spreading germs, but we are still working and are here for you when needed.

Because of the mandates for social distancing, our public meeting protocol will be changing. We will still make meetings accessible for public viewing and will have a way to make sure that public concerns are heard; however, we will not be able to have more than 10 people at a Town Council meeting. We are still working out the details on how the public will have access to the meetings, so watch our Facebook page and/or website for details. You may also put concerns in writing and forward them to me or the Mayor to be forwarded to Council members and/or read during the Town Council Public







Reminder: Do not flush paper towels, disinfectant wipes, or any type of wipes because they will clog pipes and cause backups, overflows, and issues at the wastewater treatment plant. Only toilet paper should be flushed. All other products need to go into the trash.



Yard Waste/Trash Collection

Please remember that all yard waste must be placed in paper biodegradable bags, and be free of household trash, rocks or dirt. Yard waste is collected on Mondays of each week, and must be placed at curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection.

Tree limbs & trimmings too large to bag MUST be tied in bundles less than five feet in length and of reasonable size to allow convenient handling. Disposal of tree stumps, trunks or limbs larger than six inches in diameter will not be collected.

Household trash collection is on Fridays. Remember to remove your cans from the curb Friday evening.
