The Town continues to repair and maintain over 15 miles of sewer lines as well as water lines. The Town continues to update the fleet of vehicles including police and public works vehicles. The Wayfinding Sign project has been approved and installation will begin this fall. The project includes new welcome signs on Rt. 42 as well as signs directing travelers to significant points of interest, as well as our business and historic district.

Virginia State Code requires all jurisdictions to update their Comprehensive Plan every five years. This plan provides a path for the Town Staff, Council and its citizens The plan focuses on the town makeup and administration, employment & commerce, transportation, public services, land use, and how those elements affect each other and the future of the Town. Each section of the plan is an

overview of how the Town intends to address concerns, manage growth and be conscious of revering the things that have made Dayton an outstanding place to live. I would like to thank the Planning Commission, Council and staff for all of their work in updating the plan.

The Dayton Town Council allocates funds to the Dayton Economic Development Authority who is responsible for dispersing the funds to approved Façade Grant applicants. We encourage businesses to apply for the grant which will be no less than \$500 and no greater than \$2500.

Congratulations to the many students who have graduated high school and college. I am excited for you and the many adventures that are in your future. 

### **Authority & Board Vacancies**

Looking to get involved in local government and have a voice in your community?

We have vacancies on the Economic Development Authority and the Board of
Zoning Appeals! We are looking for diverse candidates that have an interest in
the future development of Dayton.

The Dayton Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) shall be responsible for conducting public hearings of 1) appeals of administrative decisions made by the Zoning Administrator, 2) applications for variances which are regulated by the Zoning Ordinance, and 3) the establishing of setbacks for non-conforming buildable lots of record within the Town. Members of the BZA are recommended by the Dayton Town Council and appointed by the Circuit Court of Rockingham County.

The primary purpose of the Dayton Economic Development Authority (EDA) is to administer the Town's Façade Enhancement Grant. The EDA meets quarterly to review and act on these applications unless there are no applications that quarter. Members of the EDA are appointed by the Town Council.

The deadline to apply for both vacancies has been extended to August 10, 2023. To be eligible for consideration, a letter of interest and resume is required to be submitted to Meggie Roche, Economic & Community Development Coordinator at mroche@daytonva.us or dropped off at Town Hall.



### Water Treatment Plant Ribbon Cutting

The Town held a Ribbon Cutting & Open House for the new Water Treatment Plant on Friday, May 12th.

The approximately \$3.5 million project will significantly increase the amount of water the Town can produce.



Just one of the new filtration systems can produce more than the three filtration systems combined that were in the old plant.
