A friendly reminder regarding snow removal from sidewalks to help keep our pedestrians safe. Dayton Town Code §2-64, states that all persons occupying, owning or having charge of any property within the town shall be required to remove the snow from the entire sidewalk in front of such property within six daylight hours after the snow has ceased to fall, or the Town may have the snow cleaned off at the expense of the owner or tenant.

DAYTON CHRISTMAS PARADE & TREE LIGHTING

Saturday, December 6th

Parade Begins at 4:30 p.m. (Participant Line-up at 3:00 p.m.)

The Dayton Christmas Parade will begin on North Main Street at the bridge near Fort Harrison and travel south, ending at Mason Street. Line-up for participants will begin at 3:00 p.m. on Main Street, from the bridge to Eberly Road, and when this area is filled, line-up will extend to the block of Main Street north of Eberly Road (the section where Mole Hill Bikes is located).

Parking will not be permitted on Main Street during the parade, so please remove all vehicles from the street no later than 3:00 p.m. Alternate parking is available in the BB&T parking lot on the <u>east</u> side of Dingledine Lane. Dingledine Lane will remain open with two-way traffic flow while the streets are closed.

The following streets will be closed:

- Main St.
 - Mill St. to Eberly Rd. (3:00 p.m. until approx. 5:30 p.m.)
 - Eberly Rd. to John Wayland Hwy. (3:00 p.m. until approx. 5:30 p.m.)
 - Mill St. to Mason St. (4:00 p.m. until approx. 5:30 p.m.)
- <u>Huffman Dr</u>. from John Wayland Hwy. to Main St. (4:00 p.m. until approx. 5:30 p.m.)
- College St. from Main St. to Mill St. (4:00 p.m. until approx. 5:30 p.m.)
- Mill St. from Main St. to College St. (4:00 p.m. until approx. 5:30 p.m.)

The Town invites schools, churches, organizations and local businesses to participate in the parade. For information on parade registration, call the Dayton Town Office at 879-2241. No entry fee.

Manager's Desk

Earlier this year, after the The Heritage Museum's State Certification as Historic Dayton's Tourist Information Center, located at 382 High Street, we completed installing Attraction Signs on Interstate 81 at Exit 240, both northbound and southbound. In addition, Virginia Logos completed the installation of TrailBlazer (blue and white) signs from I-81, Exit 240, directly to The Heritage Museum by way of the Dayton Farmers Market, and right down Main Street via the downtown businesses.

The most recent advisory from The Heritage Museum reports about a 15 percent increase in their visitation. They feel this increase is due to our interstate work, all of which uses Route 42 and Main Street for that access.

Lately, we have encouraged

several downtown businesses about the possibility of using evening lighting, within the capabilities of their electrical systems. in some of their shop windows to illuminate their window and items within. The use of small LEDs could provide a great deal of bright illumination in a number of small areas, and work well on a timer. The idea is changing the look of the businesses during evening hours, when darkness comes early, which would be seen primarily by local residents. Also, discussed was the possibly of similarly enhancing some existing outside sconce/porch lights that might be able to cast light on sidewalk portions as well.

On November 4^{th} , we spent most of the day working on cleaning the almost 400 feet of storm drain concrete pipe that

runs along the west side of Route 42 south, from the point where we left off in September (from Main Street), to where it crosses Route 42 to the Cargill side. At the same time, VDOT's pipe cleaner cleaned the storm drain from there to the outfall at Cargill, and also the storm drain that crosses the Route 42 and Huffman Drive intersection toward Cargill. We also re-cleaned the pipe from the inlet in front of New-To-Me Consignment Shop on Main Street, all the way to Route 42, a distance of about 240 feet or so. All told, over 700 feet of storm drain was run on November 4th. It's probably not completely clean, but closer than it has been for a long time.
