Manager's Message: *Bob Holton*

Over the next few months I will be serving as vour interim town manager. Many of you may remember me from my 40+ years managing Bridgewater. In fact, my first three weeks in office included have the pleasant surprise of reconnecting with many friends who had interacted with me in my previous job. I have also had the pleasure of meeting some incredible community members since starting.

I will prepare a report for the Council suggesting ways we can serve our citizens better.

Once these tasks are completed, I will once again fade into retirement and leave the managing of this wonderful town in the hands of our new town manager.

New and Familiar Faces on Town Council

Heidi Hoover resigned her seat on Town Council effective November 26, 2022. Ms. Hoover first joined the Town of Dayton as a Planning Commissioner in September of 2019 and then was elected to Council in November 2020 to serve a 4-year term beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2024. During her tenure, she was most active with the personnel and police committees, serving as chair of both. We wish Ms. Hoover the very best in the future and hope that she will remain active in the community.

Accordingly, Ms. Hoover's resignation left us with a vacancy on the Council. A special election will be held in November, 2023 to fill the vacancy for the term of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. At the January Council Meeting, Council appointed Bob Wolz to fill the vacancy through December 31, 2023. Mr. Wolz served on the Town Council from November 8, 2021 through December 31, 2022 and we are delighted to have him
