

From the desk of Fort Harrison: December Wrap-up

The Board of Directors of Fort Harrison extends appreciation to all who attended and contributed wreaths for our fifth Wreaths Across America event on December 16th, 2023 at the Dayton Cemetery. Wreaths were placed on all known veteran graves in the cemetery, a total of two hundred and fourteen graves.

It is very appropriate that Fort Harrison sponsors this event since the land on which this cemetery is located was once the property of Daniel Harrison, one of the earliest settlers in this part of the Shenandoah Valley.

As a militia captain during the French and Indian War, Daniel Harrison would have been one of the first veterans in this community. The oldest stone in the cemetery is that of Mary Harrison who died in 1794 at age 26. It is believed that Daniel Harrison and other family members are buried near her grave.
