# Historic Dayton: A look back at the Virginia Organ Company



In the late 1800s, Dayton was fast becoming a center of music publishing in Virginia. Shenandoah Collegiate Institute and School of Music, now Shenandoah University located in Winchester, focused on music at its core. Printers Joseph Funk and Sons relocated from Singers Glen to Dayton and re-established itself as The Ruebush-Kieffer Company. Ephraim Ruebush and Aldine Kieffer printed many music books and a monthly periodical called The Musical Million, a Journal of Music, Poetry, and Chaste Home Literature.

The Musical Million included musical scores, articles related to music and religion, and letters from subscribers to the journal. The Million also contained numerous advertisements for Ruebush-Kieffer books. In practice, the Million was a savvy marketing tool for the business partners to sell the shape-note system which then encouraged purchases of their products.

Dayton's musical history also includes a manufacturing operation. In November of 1882, Aldine Kieffer built the Virginia Organ factory on Mill Street in Dayton.

An 1882 issue of The Old Commonwealth newspaper reported that the citizens of Dayton were excited to have a new business venture in their town: "We are glad to note this enterprise which we believe will be of immense advantage not only to the thriving village of Dayton, but of this whole section. The organ company expects to be able to manufacture about fifty organs per month at the start, which will be increased to meet the demand."

Again, the Million supported product advertising. A December 1882 article reported that "A look through the factory of the company will convince the most incredulous that an enterprise of more than ordinary magnitude has been successfully established in our town, and an

examination of their instruments will further prove the excellence of work and superiority of design announced by them."

The Virginian Organ Factory burned down in 1886. The losses were so great that the venture was discontinued. Rocktown History displays an organ manufactured by the Virginia Organ Company in the gallery pictured here:
